Employee Protection


- Work from home as much as possible.
- Screen all employees reporting to work for COVID 19 symptoms.
- Temperatures should not exceed 100.4°F
- All employees are to wear dedicated face masks and gloves.
- Social Distancing. "Further is safer"
- Increase hygiene practices.
- All employees should stay home if feeling ill, report any symptoms of illness to supervisor.
- Employers should maintain the confidentiality of employee health information.
- Families First Coronavirus Response Act
- Update the Employee Illness Policy OR create a COVID-19 specific policy.

Consumer Protection

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Limit the number of customers in the restaurant to 50% of seating capacity.

Tables should be spaced at least 6 feet apart.






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Mark any indoor or outdoor waiting area so that social distancing standards are met.

Live music is not permitted.

Screen customers for illness via questions or temperature.



Business Process Adaptations

- Sanitization of high-contact surfaces at least every 2 hours.
- Place hand sanitizer stations in lobby, bathrooms, and cashier stations.
- Use disposable menus OR sanitize between use.
- Use rolled silverware stored in sealed bins(gloves should be used when rolling silverware)
- Sanitize chairs after each table turns.
- Sanitize all tabletop items, including condiments, after each table turns (or use disposables)
- Do not offer self-serve buffets, condiments for use by multiple tables, or beverage station re-use.

Additional Guidance for bars

- 6 feet spacing between bar seating or standing.
- Sanitizer should be used upon entering and should be available at each seating.
- Disposable drink containers only.
- Clean and disinfect bar and seating with every change in patron.
- Parties and live music are not permitted.

COVID-19 Economic Impact on Tourism Industry



- Flight schedules ramping up and incoming passenger loads predicted to increase
- American Airlines, Delta Air Lines, JetBlue, Silver Airways, Spirit, United, Cape Air and Air Sunshine continue to service the Territory
- Health screening has begun
- <u>COVID-19 Flight updates</u>



- Seaports remain open
- Cruise activity not expected to return until at least late summer/early fall 2020



- Marine guidelines include health screening
- Vessels are required to abide by orders and compliance requests of the USCG, CBP, DPNR, and all government Emergency Executive Orders
- Charter vessels can conduct day charters for VI residents & visitors
- Charter vessels can conduct weekly charters with VI residents or visitors



General guidance for COVID-19 passenger screening for Domestic/International Arrivals

- All arriving passengers MUST wear a facial covering upon terminal disembarkation in accordance with USVI guidelines.
- All arriving passengers are hereby given notice that upon arrival into a U.S. Virgin Islands port they will be subject to certain COVID-19 screening procedures outlined below and that ALL arriving passengers by embarkation on an arriving aircraft or vessel grant their consent to these procedures upon arrival.
- Upon aircraft or vessel arrival, a representative will advise passengers about the screening procedures.
- Upon exiting the aircraft or vessel, ALL passengers will be escorted to the Virgin Islands Port Authority temperature checkpoint and will be required to complete a Traveler Screening Questionnaire.
- *At this checkpoint, ALL passengers will have their temperatures taken.
 - If the passenger has a temperature reading below 100.4°F and answers "NO" to all questions on the COVID-19 Traveler Screening Tool, he/she will be given a Virgin Islands Department of Health (VIDOH) COVID-19 Health Alert Card and will be free to leave.
 - If the passenger screens above 100.4°F, he/she will be escorted by the Department of Health (VIDOH) for purposes of quarantine and a second temperature screening, due to possible atmospheric temperature effects on body temperature.
 - After a 10-minute break, VIDOH personnel will retake the passenger's temperature.
 - If the passenger's temperature is below 100.4°F after the second temperature reading, and the passenger has answered "NO" to all the questions, he/she will be given a Virgin Islands Department of Health COVID-19 Health Alert Card and will be free to leave.
 - If the passenger's temperature remains at 100.4°F or above and/or the passenger has answered "YES" to any of the questions, the following steps should be taken:
 - If the passenger is a visitor, he/she will be required to go directly to his/her accommodations provider and will be required to self-quarantine while awaiting COVID-19 testing by the VIDOH Epidemiology Team within the next 24 hours.
 - If the arriving passenger is a resident, he/she will be required to head directly to his/her residence or place of abode and self-quarantine until an appointment for COVID-19 testing is arranged by the VIDOH Epidemiology Team the following day.
